In a Finnish city of Tampere there is a famous Spy Museum. It's interesting that on opening day the number of the bus, driving to the museum, was changed. Name this new THREE-DIGIT NUMBER.

Answer: 007.

Commentary: It is the same as the code number of a famous British spy James Bond.




20-year-old Kate Winslet and 87-year-old Gloria Stuart were nominated to Oscar in 1998. This situation had never occurred in the history of the Academy Award before. Why was it unique?

Answer: Both actresses were nominated to Oscar for one and the same role of Rose DeWitt Bukater in the film "Titanic".

Answer: chopsticks

Answer: Gadget






Answer: northern lights Commentary: the north of Minnesota is famous for its unspoilt and dark night sky, which makes it a perfect place for watching the northern lights.

Korneychukov was the real name of Korney Chukovsky.







Officially there are thirteen Disney Princesses.


